

27 May, 2011. **Hundreds of school children from sixteen (16) primary schools assembled at the Pangai Lahi ground in the early hours of the morning in order to march into the Teufaiva Outdoor Stadium to welcome Her Majesty Queen Halaevalu Mata'aho, the Guest of Honour for the day.**

A cross-section of these schools was from the Central Nuku'alofa areas. Each Primary school was led by a college brass band.

The second part of the event continues with secondary school students performing traditional and cultural items at the Teufaiva Outdoor Stadium. The program began with the Hon. Frederica Tuita performing in a 'Ma'ulu'ulu' item, followed by a 'Kailao' performance by Tonga College, and the Hon. 'Etani Tuku'aho.

Schools performed various dances items from the group tau'olunga, soke, fa'ahi ula to the ma'ulu'ulu in the beautiful sunshine.

Education Day is not a new incentive as School Parades and Marching always marks the opening and closing of Parliament. Since culture has been re-enforced in the Educational Development programme, schools have now kept it alive through cultural performances of Tongan traditional dances and songs. The event also included presentation of gifts and offer of goodwill from Education sector to mark the celebration of Her Majesty's 85<sup>th</sup> Birthday on 29 May.
